Entry requirements

Students must have completed an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) recognised Diploma in Hospitality Management in order to obtain entry to this program.

Note: students must check to see when and where a course is offered before attempting to enrol. See the course availability section in this handbook for details.

A recommended study schedule for this program can be obtained from the faculty website or your Program Advisor. Students may determine their own schedule based upon credit transfers and personal study requirements. It is important to note that full-time students usually enrol in 4 courses per term and part-time students usually enrol in 2 courses per term.

International students

English language proficiency requirements

To be eligible for admission to CQU's degree programs, in addition to academic prerequisites, international applicants are required to have an acceptable level of competence in writing, reading, speaking and understanding English.

Generally, students wishing to undertake undergraduate programs are required to have an overall IELTS band score of 6.0 (with no individualband score of less than 5.0), or a TOEFL score of 550 (Internet-basedscore of 79 or computer-based score of 213), including a TWE of 4.
